	<b>Optional Candidate Statement of Qualifications Submittal Deadline</b> All candidates who opt to include a Candidate Statement of Qualifications in the County Sample Ballot Pamphlet provided to voters by the Stanislaus County Registrar of Voters office must submit a statement and pay the deposit when the candidate's Declaration of Candidacy is filed. August 6 – November 3 (E-90 to E-1)	Late Contributions and Independent Expenditures of \$1000 or More Within 24 hours of the transaction, FPPC Form 462 and Form 496 or Form 497 must be filed with the appropriate filing officer. GC 82036, 82036.5, 84200.6
August 8 5 p.m. (E-88)	<b>Close of Candidate Nomination Period</b> Candidate nomination documents are due. Incumbents who wish to file as a candidate for their own office must file by this date. The petition must be signed by at least 0.1% (at least 100 but no more than 600) qualified registered voters.
